

GIOIA

Italian, noun/definition: gladness, glee, great delight, joy.

Robert (Bob) Gioia was always a gentleman as well as a determined businessman and dedicated competitor. Starting in his early days at Washington Irving Jr. High School in Los Angeles circa 1950, he was on the gymnastics team where he set the bar among his fellow students for physical acumen, composure, and achievement. The gymnastics team at Washington Irving included another talented young man, a 'younger classmate' of Bob's, Albert (Al) Yapelli.

The next stop for Bob was Eagle Rock High School where he continued developing his gymnastics, his tumbling skills, and his strength on the parallel bars. It was during this time that he developed his drive to succeed. With his playful nature, Bob was never one to leave out some mischievous fun along the way. In high school Bob was known to engage in a little hooky from time to time. One of those times, sneaking off from his classmates, Bob biked the short distance to Griffith Park where he loved to visit. It was in Griffith Park, a wonderfully lush urban oasis where he spied on the set of *The Invasion of The Body Snatchers*. In awe of the set coordination and talented athletic actors, Bob dreamed that one day he would be in the spotlight. As he ran his fingers through his quaffed pompadour, he thought those perfectly made-up actors and their talents had nothing over him. 'Why not?' thought Bob, the budding innovator and businessman.

It was during his years at Eagle Rock that Bob, inspired by his father Joseph and encouraged by his mother Rosalie, applied his quick reflexes and physical skills as a young race car driver. He never missed a chance to push his competitive instincts and was a regular race winner on the podium.

Bob's love of competition, his athletic prowess and drive to achieve brought him to the world of trap shooting. It was the 1960s. Along with Joseph and Rosalie in the family wagon, Bob never missed a monthly meet of the Golden Bears at Floyd Davis's International Trap and Skeet Club in the 1,500-acre Whittier Narrows Recreation area bordered by San Gabriel Boulevard to the north and Santa Anita and Merced Avenues to the south and east (known today as LA Clays). Bob was again enjoying the podium as a young trap shooter. Incidentally, the Whittier Narrows was home to the Charles Gay Lion Farm, whose lions starred in many of the Tarzan productions such as *Tarzan and His* Mate and Son of Tarzan, which were shot in the hills and swamps of the Whittier Narrows. In this idyllic location, Bob competed at The Golden Bears with other shooters arriving the day before in their motorhomes and campers, filling the parking lot with barbecues smoking and beer flowing. With 300+ competitors, no one dared hold an ATA event on a Golden Bears Sunday! It was on one of those Sundays that fate had its way and Bob's 'younger classmate' from high school found him setting the competitive bar once again. This time it was young Al Yapelli (California Hall of Fame inductee, 2021) on the 16-yard line standing a post away who recognized his junior high school classmate.

Bob's love of cars and automobile mechanics eventually landed him at racing pits around the country with Melling Engine Parts where he applied his competitive and innovative talents as their factory representative, traveling the country, developing the Melling Engine Parts name and growing their business.

Ever since his introduction to trap shooting at the Floyd Davis's Club, Bob loved trap shooting and all its competitive and social rewards. While watching the motor homes arrive, he dreamed of his own someday. Being ever humorous and good-natured, and always the proud Italian, he painted big letters on the side of his 'Winnadago'. While traveling the country and building the business for Melling Engine Parts, he always made time for his beloved trap shooting, which included shooting in Texas, Missouri, New Mexico, Arizona and Nevada among other states. And he was always at the Grand American. He attended the Grand American for 36 years in a row in Vandalia, Ohio and lastly in Sparta, Illinois in 2006.

The California State Shoot in Kingsburg was Bob's favorite. It was at the Kingsburg shoot where he set the bar for selflessness and generosity. For 20 years Bob sponsored the targets for the state team's 200 singles competitors. Bob was a California Golden State Trapshooter's Association (CGSTA) Board Member, the Treasurer during the mid-1980s, and President in 1986. In that year, while leaving the stage after delivering his President's address, Bob tripped and lunged forward, surely to land head first onto the floor. But his Eagle Rock High School Gymnastics Team tumbling skills came into play once again. With his feet straight up in the air Bob managed to tuck and roll, completely flipping over, and came up on one foot with his other leg kneeling. Head held high and with both arms extended to the heavens in front of a thousand attendees, Bob then said in a booming voice reminiscent of the greatest stage actors, "ta dah!".

It was also at the California State Shoot grounds that Bob saw a need and an opportunity to apply his vision and talents. He joined the Board of Directors of the California Hall of Fame (HOF) in 1987. The HOF was established in 1973 in a trailer placed on the shooting grounds at Kingsburg with no other place for the safekeeping and display of historical records and mementos. Bob and the HOF Board came up with the idea for a permanent building. Once again Bob set the bar for generosity by giving his talent, time, and money. He participated on the HOF Board for 25 years with the many other talented people who donated in the planning and organizing of the Hall that we share in and enjoy today.

Thank you, Bob, for your contributions to the Hall of Fame and your enthusiasm for the many generations of shooters in the past, present and future and for being a dedicated and generous friend to all of us in our trap shooting family.
